Mary is frequently invited to present workshops and master classes in the U.S and abroad. She has produced two video tutorials, "BelCanto/Can Belto: Teaching Women to Sing Musical Theatre" and "What about the Boys?" and is co-author of the book "Cross-Training in the Voice Studio: A Balancing Act" with Penn State colleague Norman Spivey. Mary is a 2018 recipient of a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Contemporary Commercial Music Vocal Pedagogy Institute at Shenandoah University.
